We are confident that we can absorb inflation increases from our suppliers, insurers and of course the rates and business rates we pay to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Due to the tight financial control of this current Council we can announce, the unheard of, REDUCTION OF THE PRECEPT BY 5%.

The Council wrote to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council regarding gritting of roads and footpaths during icyweather.
The reply received from Mr L Burton on behalf of Mr John Skidmore Head of Streetscene Services included the following points:-

1) We have an approved network of footpaths that are treated when the forecast predicts ice or snow, these are generally in the main shopping area

in the main shopping areas and Town Centres. The Town Council has written back to ask what is the approved network in Bridlington and were they done?

2) As far as gritting routes are concerned, bus routes should be gritted.

3) Mr Tony Neill responded regarding Grit bins. There are 35 grit bins in Bridlington (Locations can be obtained from the Editor of this Newsletter who would be interested to know if they are still there



 Plateau type humps are preferred to the cushion offset type which damage suspensions

Plateau type damage to parked vehicles No one minded losing kerb parking space to plateau humps

Worst Road that needs removal is St. John's Avenue as asymmetrical humps could lead to damage to parked vehicles in these narrow roads.

This was registered for Kirkgate and other offset areas. Belvedere Grove and St. Martin's Grove were also mentioned as areas for sensitive reduction. Most respondents thought that 20mph zones did not need further measures but required policing.

BioBag Dog -Dog Waste Bags

Bridlington Town Council will sell the above dog-waste disposal bags from October at a cost of £1.25 per box of 50 bags

What is the "BioBag Dog"?

The "Biobag Dog" is a biodegradable & compostable dog waste bag, which has the following advantages:

- Reduces short & long term littering effects
- Can be treated hygienically in sewage plants with sludge digestion & will biodegrade quickly under these conditions
- Allows the moisture to evaporate so contents dry-out (if they are stood upon they won't produce the usual mess)
- Leak proof, allow aerobic biodegradation & prevent smell that occurs when dog waste ferments in a closed plastic bag
- Bio-Plastic bag based on corn starch & vegetable oil, and does not contain any polyethylene. Certified as compostable according to the European Standard EN-13432 (this means that they will biodegrade within 45 days under composting conditions)

Residents should be able to take advantage of a cost price product and the opportunity of using a product that is a cleaner and more environmentally friendly.
