UNVEILING OF THE MEMORIAL STONE



A Memorial Stone was unveiled in the War Memorial Gardens on Wednesday 15th August with a Service that was attended by many organisations and groups of Bridlington. This stone is to honour the sacrifices the many have made for our Nation and is to celebrate the non-uniform war efforts like those who worked in the munition factories and the farmers who continued to grow food to feed the local area. This project is a very good example of partnership working in Bridlington between the Public and Voluntary Sector involving Bridlington Town Council, the Lords Feoffees of the Manor of Bridlington and the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

REMEMBRANCE DAY COMMEMORATION SUNDAY 11th NOVEMBER 2018

The Bridlington Town Council will be hosting the Remembrance Day Celebrations on Sunday 11th November 2018. This year is a little different in that it is also the Centenary of the end of World War I and the whole country will be marking the occasion together by undertaking several events in conjunction with the normal 11.00am Service.

The Battle's O'er Nation's Tribute will incorporate many aspects however there is one element that will affect the residents that live around the Bridlington War Memorial gardens at a rather early hour. The gunfall silent at the end of the First World War at 06.00 hours. Across the country before dawn has broken over a thousand bagpipes will play "Battle's O'er" which is a traditional air played by pipers after a battle and it is intended for one lone piper to play this lament at 06.00am at the Bridlington War Memorial.

For your information the centenary events for the day is currently planned as follows:

- 06:00 am The Battle's O'er - performed by a Lone Piper at the Bridlington War Memorial.
- 11:00 am The Remembrance Service at the Bridlington War Memorial (estimated) The Service to Remember the WWI Fallen at Bridlington Priory Church.
- 12:00 pm Beacons of Light, WWI Beacon III by the West door at the Bridlington Priory.
- 12:05 pm Ringing out for Peace - the bells will ring at the Bridlington Priory Church to signify the end of the days celebrations.

There is Free Car Parking in Bridlington for the whole day in all East Riding of Yorkshire Car Parks. The Town Council would like to thank everyone in advance for their co-operation with the Centenary events this year and sincerely hopes that the lament is not too disruptive to the residents near the Bridlington War Memorial on the day.

INVESTING IN OUR TOWN

The Bridlington Town Council have been searching for some time for a property for offices in the town centre of Bridlington that would be able to incorporate a big community investment in the Town. The Town Council is determined to offer the Town some viable community space as such a purchase would only be justifiably in the best interests of the residents. The building being purchased is located on Marshall Avenue and will be able to provide both a versatile upstairs community space and town council office space which will hopefully help to transform some services to the Town Centre area as the whole building will be fully Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) compliant in order to accommodate the needs of all.

Bridlington Town Council is currently working closely with East Riding Voluntary Action Services (ERVAS), members of the Bridlington Youth Coalition and local charities to source additional funding to ensure that the cost to the public is minimised and that services provided will be of maximum benefit to the whole of the Bridlington community. It is envisaged that the building will be open at least 5 days a week and will include an informal community space, training and educational space, employment, volunteering and apprenticeship opportunities, a café, a range of drop in services, along with meeting spaces and offices available for other local services, small businesses and community groups to use.
