My Mayoral year has been tinged with sadness as Bridlington Town Council said goodbye to Councillors Ray Allerston and Michael Charlesworth and former Councillor David Metcalf who will be missed by all who knew them. I welcomed two new Councillors Glenn Holmes and Thelma Milns.

This year I have attended over 100 Civic Events on behalf of Bridlington Town Council and each one has left a special memory. In particular the events to commemorate the Centenary of WW1 will forever be in my memory as the town showed that collectively "We Will Remember Them".

This year I chose RSPCA Bridlington Branch as the Mayor's Charity and I have had the pleasure of working with committed volunteers raising money for the Charity. Highlights of the year were the Pet Blessing Service and Pet Carol Service held at the Priory Church of St Mary and hosted by Reverend Matthew Pollard.

I was proud to represent the Town at the Tour de Yorkshire Inaugurate Cycle Race and the many build up events. Team Bridlington really show what can be done when we all pull together. The town looked amazing with colourful blue & yellow bunting, decorated bikes, a pebble beach bike and blue fish! We showcased our wonderful town to the world.

Another event that caused the town to pull together was the filming of the new Dads Army movie. Our beautiful Old Town was transformed into Walmington-on-Sea. Many residents took part in the film including our own Town Councillor Cyril Marburg who ably played the Mayor of Walmington-on-Sea. I had hoped to take that part myself but there were no female Mayors in the 1940s – how times have changed.

This year was the second time I have had the honour of being Mayor of Bridlington Town Council and I have been supported by my Consort Mike Finlay, my Deputy Mayor Councillor John Copsey, his Deputy Mayoress Jacqui Copsey, wonderful staff and fellow Town Councillors. It has been a good year.

Council Year 2014 - 2015

The Council year commenced with only one person being nominated to be the Mayor of Bridlington and Councillor Shelagh Finlay was voted in and her consort for the year was her husband Mr Mike Finlay. The Mayors charity this year was the Bridlington RSPCA. There were two nominations for the position of Deputy Mayor, with Councillor M Milns and Councillor Copsey being nominated and seconded and when put to the vote Councillor Copsey took it with a majority show of hands.

In May, the Council resolved to move Finance & General Purposes meetings to the day time and that Full Council meetings would remain as evening meetings. At the Full Council meeting in May the council approved all the relevant paperwork to continue with the last year of this term of office on the Council. Councillor Marsburg was elected as the Chairman of both the Planning & Environmental Committee & the Staffing Committee.

In June the Mayor and Councillors attended the D-Day remembrance service at the Bridlington War Memorial. The Skatepark Coordinator successfully secured a grant from the Bridlington Lions Club. The Annual report for 2013-2014 was published. Also in June the Council was forced to have a bi-election for the vacancy on the council and Councillor Thelma Milns was welcomed to Bridlington Town Council.

In July the Council awarded the Business in Bloom trophy and framed certificates to first, second and third place winners at the Full Council meeting. The Council also resolved to proceed with recruiting a Civic & Administrative Officer. Councillor Finlay was elected as the Chairman of the Finance & General Purposes Committee. At the July meeting a Police Constable attended to brief the meeting as to the current happenings in Bridlington and the way Humberside Police were effectively dealing with the issues they faced. The Council resolved to contact the East Riding of Yorkshire Council regarding the railings at the Bridlington War Memorial as they were not fit for purpose and in a terrible state of repair. The Staffing Committee resolved to look at the recruitment of a bespoke Civic & Administrative Officer. Councillor Finlay was elected at the Chairman of the Newsletter Committee.

In August the Town Council interviewed for the position of Civic & Administrative Officer and Mrs Lynne Henderson joined the council's office staff.

In September sadly Councillor Raymond Allerston passed away and the Council held a one minute silence, as a mark of respect, at the beginning of the Full Council meeting. Councillor Allerston had been a Bridlington Town Councillor since the Council was established in 2000. The biannual award of the small grants to nineteen (19) local organisations and community groups took place sharing a total of £3950.00.

October the Council authorised the purchase of notice boards for the display of the Children's Christmas Card Competition as the competition submissions has increased year on year. This month saw a reduction in the cleaning costs for the St John Street toilets. The Council authorised the purchase of the Christmas pomanders for the Town. The Council received the

information that the vacancy on the Council had not been petitioned and that the Council were free to move forward with a co-option.

In November at the Full Council meeting the co-option of a Councillor for Bridlington North Ward took place and the new Councillor voted in was Councillor Glenn Holmes. The Council approved the purchase of the Spring flower baskets for the Town. The Council's Internal Auditor Half Year Report and Internal Audit Review Forms were successfully received and approved with no issues arising. The Mayor presented the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes to the winners of the Christmas Card Competition in three local Bridlington Schools. At November's Full Council meeting Mr Paul Robinson, the Deputy Police Crime Commissioner and Inspector Grant Taylor from Humberside Police attended to brief on the current situation with crime in Bridlington and how the Police restructuring would impact on the immediate area.

December saw the Town Council's Christmas event take place in the Promenades Shopping Centre and many of the Town Councillors were in attendance helping with the event which was a complete success. Councillor Glenn Holmes attended his first meeting with the Council. The Town Council submitted proposals to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council regarding the Transport Plan. The Council created a collated response with the Lord Feoffees of the Manor of Bridlington to a letter received from the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum.

Sadly in January Councillor Michael Charlesworth passed away and the Council held a one minute silence, as a mark of respect, at the beginning of the Full Council meeting. Councillor Charlesworth had been a Bridlington Town Councillor since 2003. The Town Council agreed in principle to take responsibility for the Heritage Display Boards in Bridlington Old Town. The Skatepark undertook its Annual Safety Inspection and all risks identified are classed as low. All items are to be monitored but no immediate action was necessary at this time. The Service Level Lighting Agreement with the East Riding of Yorkshire Council was approved. The Council agreed the budget and precept demand for 2016/2016 of £182,948.66, which is a zero percent increase/decrease on the 2014/2015. Three LIDL representatives attended the Full Council meeting in January to request support for the proposals for a scheme in Bridlington. The Website Consultant and the Skatepark Coordinators contracts were approved for renewal. January saw the approval of eleven (11) local groups, organisations or business nominations from the Bridlington Town Council for the Chairman of East Riding of Yorkshire Council's awards.

February saw the Council approve working towards a Local Council Award Scheme in due course but that it would entail Councillor training and would be best to be undertaken following the forthcoming elections.

In March the Council presented the Second Honorary Citizen Award to Mrs Janet Connelly as the Council considered that the work that the late Warwick Connelly undertook for the Christmas Day dips and the how his family had continued his wonderful work to complete 48 years of fundraising was more than worthy of this award. The Council also awarded Inspector Grant Taylor a Bridlington Town Council plaque as he is leaving Bridlington, his work taking him to pastures new, and the Town Council wished to recognise the valued work the Inspector had undertaken with the Town Council and to acknowledge the time he has given to the Council with his regular attendance to Council meetings. The Town Council resolved to join the Dementia Action Alliance and set an action plan and encourage residents

and businesses in Bridlington to follow suit. The Council also renewed the Sewerby Cricket Club Summer toilet provision from 1st May – 30th September 2015. The biannual award of the small grants to fourteen (14) local organisations and community groups took place, they shared a total award of £6762.78.

In April the Council resolved to proceed with a further three year lease for the current office premises. At the April full council meeting Councillor Linda Chambers said her goodbyes as she was not standing in the forthcoming elections and had completed an eight (8) year term of office with Bridlington Town Council, she thanked her fellow Councillors for their help and friendship and she wished the Town Council well for the future. The Town Council were actively planning to decorate the office for the forthcoming Tour de Yorkshire with the Mayor decorating a bike blue and yellow to be fixed outside the office to celebrate the Tour actually starting in Bridlington.

In May the Tour de Yorkshire commenced in Bridlington with many Town Councillors and staff able to witness this event in Bridlington. Elections took place on 7th May and saw some changes to the Ward Councillors of Bridlington Town Council.

The Council will award maximum grants of £1,500 to an organisation.

- (1)** The council will only support activities that benefit Bridlington and its residents and the value of the grant is commensurate with the benefit derived (in accordance with Schedule 12 of the Local Government Act 1972).
- (2)** Aid will be considered to help towards:-
 - (a)** Capital cost of new or improved facilities or equipment;
 - (b)** Providing a public service;
 - (c)** Initial funding for new activities
 - (d)** Running costs and organisation of events
- (3)** Grant Aid is not available to individuals.
- (4)** The council will not award grants to religious or educational establishments, unless the grant is towards improving facilities or activities for the wider community.

All Grants

- (5)** Applications must be made on the attached form.
- (6)** It is a condition of an offer of a grant that acknowledgement is made by the body or organisation in some way such as in its literature, posters or programmes. This should be in the form of a statement "*Supported by Bridlington Town Council*" or similar.
- (7)** Only one grant will be considered for an organisation during the year unless there are exceptional circumstances and these are to be reported and approved by the Finance and General Purposes Committee.
- (8)** Any funds not spent for the purposes they were given must be returned to the council promptly.

Newsletter Committee Report:

This year we went from strength to strength as a Committee to produce four (4) Newsletters that informed the residents and business of the work undertaken by the Town Council. Some of the highlights are listed below:

Summer Edition 2014

The new Mayor Councillor Shelagh Finlay and Deputy Councillor John Copsey were the front page news. The Business in Bloom competition was launched along with the Bridlington based community choir Coastal Voices. This year Bridlington hosted a number of events to commemorate the First World War Centenary this featured in the Summer Newsletter. Other memorable events also were advertised in the newsletter including the Old Town Summer Festival, the Bridlington Community Armed Forces Day and a special Pet Blessing Service in aid of the Mayor of Bridlington's chosen charity the RSPCA Bridlington Branch.

Autumn Edition 2014

The front page news for the autumn edition was the Town Mayors' Civic Service, the Remembrance Day Service and the sad news that the Bridlington Town Council had a vacancy due to the sudden death of Councillor Raymond Allerston. The winners of the Business in Bloom Competition featured in the newsletter as did the new Town Councillor, Councillor Thelma Milns. Christmas events were also advertised as we launched the partnership community event in the Promenades Shopping Centre. Bridlington Town Council also announced that a new member of staff had joined the happy team; Mrs Lynne Henderson became the Civic & Administrative Officer.

Winter Edition 2014

The winter edition of the newsletter featured the winning Best Dressed Window Competition and the Mayors' Christmas Card Competition winner who posed with the Bridlington Spa Pantomime characters. Planning & Environmental Committee Report:

This year 2014-2015 planning applications put forward to Bridlington Town Council were on par with the previous year.

The economic situation having improved month by month and throughout the year has given householders more confidence in investing in their properties.

One of the main concerns the council and the general public have are the number of properties being converted to Houses of Multiple Occupation (HMO) particularly in areas where there is a high density of holiday accommodation.

Applications for Wind farms have been drastically reduced since the East Riding of Yorkshire Council have stated more of the pending applications will be refused due to our countryside is getting to the point of saturation and the government will scrap subsidies for land owners who allow such sites on their land, but may allow individual farmers and small firms to do so.

Whilst Bridlington Town Council is consulted, the views and recommendations are not always adhered to as the final decisions rest with the Planning Department at the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

Finance & General Purposes Committee Report:

The committee again had a busy year and many projects were considered and recommended. As Bridlington Town Council had again frozen the budget for this year the committee had to ensure that all the projects were carefully considered and costed.

Many requests for litter bins were sent to the committee to consider and the following were recommended, to full council, for approval:

The Purchase of Litter Bins for:

Bridlington Town Council works closely alongside East Riding Of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) on the litter bin placement scheme, with the ERYC Litter Teams emptying the bins once placed.

The committee was mindful of memberships that needed to be considered and the following were recommended, to full council, for approval:

- Renewal of the SLCC Membership
- Renewal of the ERNLLCA Membership
- Renewal of the Yorkshire Coast Community Rail Partnership Membership

The committee carefully considered previous commitments to purchase Spring hanging baskets, Christmas pomanders and seafront flags and recommended to full council that these projects be undertaken again in the 2014/2015 year. The committee also recommended that the council proceed with an agreement to take responsibility for the maintenance, cleaning and minor repairs of the newly installed display boards located at Stepney Grove Car Park and the Junction of High Street and St John's Street.

The committee was mindful of the need to support events run by various local organisations to encourage visitors to Bridlington and support local businesses. The committee recommended approval of financial support for the following events:

- Bridlington Town Criers Competition 2015 - £1000.00
- Bridlington Old Town Association – Dickensian Festival 2014 - £500.00
- Coastal Voices Choir – Christmas Event 'Carols around the Town' - £75.00

The committee considered throughout the year its statutory and non-statutory responsibilities:

The committee considered the Aims and Objectives 2011-2015 and resolved not to make any amendments at this time.

St John's Toilets - The committee received information regarding the cleaning costs of the toilets and was pleased to note that ERYC had agreed to reduce the annual costs by £2917.36.

Sewerby Cricket Club Toilets Summer General Public Provision - The committee resolved to renew the contract for the 2015 season - Easter and then 1st May 2015 to 30th September 2015.

The Service Level Agreement Costs for Footway Lighting - The committee noted details of the cost of the service level agreement and requested that the item be re-viewed in six months, with a report from ERYC on the progress of the roll out of the lantern upgrades and any works carried out in the six months.

The committee resolved to investigate the feasibility and value of submitting an application for the Gasworx Skate Park and St John's Toilets to be listed as Community Assets.

The Bridlington Town Council Budget 2015/2016 - The committee recommended the approval of the budget of £182,948.66 (a zero percent increase/decrease on the 2014-2015 budget).

The Bridlington Town Council's Precept Demand 2015/2016 – The committee recommended that the Council approve the precept demand of £182,948.66 (a zero percent increase/decrease on the 2014-2015 precept).

The committee received the details of the Internal Auditor's Half Year Report and noted that there are no issues arising to be addressed.

Skatepark Coordinator Report:

We provide a challenging sporting environment for children and young adults (who aren't attracted to traditional team sports) a place to go and express themselves in an individual and athletic manner. Getting children, particularly those at-risk involved in a personal and esteem-building activity like skateboarding/riding helps them build the confidence to do well in other aspects of their lives.

The coordinator is a point of contact for adults who may have concerns about the park or require advice e.g. skatepark etiquette, accompanying younger children etc.

Various meetings have been held with young people to plan and organise a free celebration and competition at the park. Unfortunately the summer Skatejam was cancelled on the day - due to the bad weather (10th August.) It was impossible to arrange another date which was suitable for all the volunteers i.e. photographer, film crew, staffing for BBQ etc.

Maintenance – the coordinator ensures the grass is cut fortnightly throughout the growing season.. The park is cleaned daily (apart from Christmas Day) and the skip is emptied as required. Any incidents are followed up with meetings with CCTV/police as appropriate e.g. skip fire, damage to MUGA, bin fire. Offensive graffiti is removed from the park as and when required. A daily written inspection is carried out and an annual report is commissioned by an external risk assessment agency.

The brush box (funded with an external grant) is kept replenished with tools and responsible older park users have the keys so are able to take some ownership in the cleaning of the park, setting a good example to younger riders.

Skatelessons

Many grant applications have been completed and external funding has been secured £500 from Cash 4 Clubs - Bridlington Lions £540 - Hull and East Riding Charitable Trust £1000.

Free weekly lessons are held on a Friday 4-5pm for beginners and 5-6pm for intermediate, at the skatepark when the weather is dry or at Headlands school when it is wet. We provide a safe environment for local youth to meet, socialise, and develop friendships based on a common, healthy interest. The adults involved are DBS checked and are trained in first aid and child safeguarding – the skate club holds the ERYCVS quality assurance awards for Sports Groups in the East Riding.

The lessons provide opportunities to

- Promote healthy lifestyles and the wellbeing of young people
- Develop a network of positive and approachable role models who encourage and promote the use of the skatepark in a friendly and positive way
- Deliver regular coaching sessions
- Increase the numbers of parents, children and young people using the park

- Provide relevant information for young people around healthy lifestyles and wellbeing by signposting them to external agencies

Media

Press releases and positive stories have been documented in the local press. There is a Facebook page that provides information on the skatepark and up to date information is included on the Bridlington Town Council webpage.

This all helps to influence wider public perceptions and provide a balance to negative media coverage. (There is a mismatch between perceptions and reality about the scale of young people's involvement in crime and anti-social behaviour. Professionals contributing to an NFER-funded research corroborate this finding from previous research and government policy. They also note that negative perceptions are detrimental to both young people and their communities.)

Baseline Information and Evidence of Need

The range and extent of challenges faced by children and young people is growing, as the financial means by which statutory organisation can support them diminishes due to the economic climate. The skatepark is open access and the skate lessons are free – we are open to all.

Childhood obesity is an increasing concern within the East Riding; with 18% of Year 6 pupils being classified as obese according to their Body Mass Index. High levels of childhood obesity are likely to lead to an increase in a wide range of chronic and acute health conditions, such as diabetes, coronary heart disease, respiratory problems, certain cancers and reduced quality of life.

Source - National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) – the nationwide programme of weighing and measuring children in Reception Year and Year 6.

A meaningful and influential relationship with a coach encourages children to seek out other beneficial mentorships in their life. Structured sport sessions provide the opportunity to build new friendships (children attend from across a cluster of schools) and learn how to manage own behaviour in a social and group environment and helps children learn conflict resolution.

Mastering tricks and skills provides the opportunity to teach children how to handle disappointment, competition, frustration and anger. Modelling positive behaviour by coaching encourages young people to use the same tools to solve conflict in other areas of their lives and develop positive interactions with other adults.

Children who are involved in sporting activity at a young age are more likely to stay active in later life.

There are documented benefits of being active for at least 60 minutes each day:

- Improves cardiovascular and bone health and maintains a healthy weight
- Improves self-confidence and develops new social skills

We engage with the wider community - the co-ordinator has met with the youth service and local schools. Bridlington School have delivered sessions at the park, supported by the skate club staff. Britax had a Family Fit Friday afternoon on the MUGA in July 2014.

Of the 44 documented skateboarding fatalities in 2013 - all were on roads – and none in a skatepark, it is important to provide somewhere safe for people to skate.
