



BRIDLINGTON TOWN COUNCIL
Minutes of the Hybrid Town Council Mayor Making Meeting
held on 11th May 2022 in the Town Council Offices,
2A Marshall Avenue, Bridlington

The hybrid meeting was held with Councillors Dealtry, Finlay, Foster, Heslop-Mullens, Holmes, C Marsburg, S Marsburg, M Milns, T Milns, Norman & Walker (11) in the room. Two Members of the Public were present. There were no councillors online. The Town Clerk facilitated and minuted the meeting.

01.22 Mayor's Welcome & Election of the Mayor of Bridlington for the Council Year 2022-2023:

Councillor Dealtry thanked everyone for their attendance and welcomed everyone to the meeting. The Mayor read out the intention to record.

Councillor Dealtry then called for the election of Mayor of Bridlington to commence. Councillor Heslop-Mullens was proposed by Councillor Dealtry and seconded by Councillor S Marsburg.

Councillor Heslop-Mullens announced that Mrs Elaine Heslop-Mullens, his wife, would be his Mayoress for the Mayoral Year 2022-2023. The Mayor's chosen charity is Candlelighters, the local cancer charity for children.

Throughout this Town Council Year the Mayor and Mayoress undertook 92 Civic Duties, Responsibilities and Training throughout the year.
