TM – She had received a call from a local motor company of Bessingby estate who have been having problems with vandalism, she requested help with patrols going round if possible? HP reply- They could touch base initially and feed back to the teams, it was asked if the vandalism had been reported?

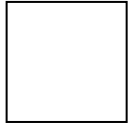
TM – Reported the garages on Greenfield Road are being used for drug taking some dates and times were passed to the police.
