Council Year 2024 – 2025

The Town Council Year Commenced with one person being nominated to be Mayor of Bridlington, Councillor Rick Arrand was duly elected to office for the Mayoral year 2024 – 2025. The Mayor announced that his wife Mrs Kim Arrand would be his Mayoress and his chosen charities were, a local dementia group (Right Minds) and The Kingfisher Café.

One person was nominated for the position of Deputy Mayor of Bridlington and Councillor Angela Walker was elected to office. She declared that her Consort would be her husband, Mr Graham Walker.

At the first business meeting in May, the Town Council approved all the official paperwork of Council, received the Annual Governance and Accounting Statements for the year and allocated Councillors to all Committees and Outside Posts and Responsibilities. Following on from the first meetings of the committees the Chairs were elected as follows: Councillor Thelma Milns Chair of the Staffing Committee, Councillor Thelma Milns Chair of the Newsletter Committee, Councillor Cyril Marsburg Chair of the Planning Committee, Councillor Tim Norman Chair of the Finance and General-Purpose Committee and Councillor Carlo Verda was elected as the Chair of the Environment Committee.

The Town Council undertakes many consultations and traffic regulation orders during the year and responds to each with comments however, there are too many to mention separately throughout this report.

In May the Council approved a change in format to the distribution of the four annual newsletters and in July Council resolved to utilise the Bridlington Echo with 12 editions of a one-and-a-half-page layout. The first edition was published in the September 2024 edition. Also, in May the Administrative Officer and the Handy Person Team were made permanent members of staff.

June, as in previous years there were no matters arising from the Internal Audit and the year-end accounts were received and the Annual Governance Statements were signed and approved for the year ending 31.03.2524.

In July the Council resolved to have a defibrillator fitted inside the building with public access during the office opening hours.

August is always a busy pre - planning month for the Council as preparations get under way for the Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service, the launch of the Mayor's Christmas card competition and the town's Christmas lights and tree switch on event.

During September the Council awarded £3,500 in Small Grants to local community groups. The Mayor of Bridlington, Councillor Rick Arrand, held his Civic Service at the Priory Church and held a raffle in aid of his charities.

October saw the Council purchase an external defibrillator for the public to access 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Council also granted funding of £500 to support the Armed Forces Day event in 2025. The Council also resumed control of the Bridlington Town Council owned allotment, formally known as Ducky Dyke Allotments. The Council also instated the new role of a Project Officer.

November is always a very poignant month for Bridlington Town Council as approximately 2,000 residents attended the Remembrance Day Service. The parade and service were attended by veterans and serving members of the forces, dignitaries of the East Riding of Yorkshire, Bridlington Mayor, Charlie Dewhirst MP and Bridlington Town Councillors. The Christmas lights and tree were installed, maintained and lit by the Council in an event in which followed the spectacular Ice Trail and festive food market which was attended by thousands. The Mayor switched on the lights with the greatly appreciated assistance of Peter Levy, of BBC's Look North, and Father Christmas.

During the December meeting Councillor John Arthur was presented with his past Mayor medal and a photo album of his year as Mayor of Bridlington. The Council held an open morning for the winners of the Mayor's Christmas card competition and public to attend to view over 600 entries which were received.

January of the new year saw the Administrative Officer upscaled to Senior Administrative Officer. The council precept for 2025 – 2026 was approved by Full council.

February, Inspector Foster attended the Full Council meeting to introduce himself and expressed his keenness to support the town and the Town Council. Council welcomed Inspector Foster to the role and welcomed the opportunity to work in conjunction. Council was also fortunate to receive a presentation from Hornsea 4 Offshore Wind Farm project regarding timescales and details of associated works. The Mayor held his Civic Dinner at the Belvedere Golf Course with many Councillors attending and 4 members of staff, once again the Mayor held a raffle in aid of his charities.

At the March meeting the purchase of spring hanging baskets was once again agreed to enhance the town. The second round of Small Grant Funding of £4947.75 was awarded to Bridlington community groups and charities. Council welcomed PC Kim Jewitt-Holder as the new Town Centre PCSO.

In April the Bridlington Town Council office extended business hours in order for the office to be open to the public from 9am to 2.30pm Monday to Friday

Small Grants Policy

It is a prime objective of the council to promote a vibrant community spirit.

This is done in various ways, including small grants to local groups. This policy is designed to help and guide local clubs, societies and organisations making applications for small grants to Bridlington Town Council. The Council will award maximum grants of £500.00 to an organisation.

- (1) The council will only support activities that benefit Bridlington and its residents and the value of the grant is commensurate with the benefit derived (in accordance with Schedule 12 of the Local Government Act 1972).
- (2) Awards will be considered to help towards:-
 - (a) Capital cost of new or improved facilities or equipment.
 - (b) Providing a community service.
 - (c) Initial funding for new activities.
 - (d) Running costs and organisation of events.
- (3) Grant Awards are not available to individuals or businesses.
- (4) The council will not award grants to religious or educational establishments, unless the grant is towards improving activities for the wider community.

All Grants

- (5) Applications must be made on the attached form.
- (6) It is a condition of an offer of a grant award that acknowledgement is made by the body or organisation in some way such as in its literature, posters or programmes. This should be in the form of a statement *"Supported by Bridlington Town Council"* or similar.
- (7) The maximum amount of small grants awards available to an organisation is £500.00 per year. (1st April to 31st March).
- (8) The council will need to review how grants awards have been spent and will require evidence to be provided to the Bridlington Town Council office by six months after the awards presentation. The council may allow an extension to this six-month period should it be satisfied of the reason. No further grant applications will be considered without satisfactory completion on this process. Any funds not spent for the purposes they were given must be promptly returned to the council.
- (9) All grants must be supported by the relevant financial statements (e.g. Bank Statement, Balance Sheet/Income and Expenditure Record) or a written statement of reasons that such information is not available.

Environmental Committee Report:

The period covered by my first report as Chair of the Environment Committee has seen a significant widening in the range of our responsibilities, activities and projects.

We took our first steps with the Neighbourhood Plan looking into funding options in July.

In October we took management of the allotments (formerly known as Ducky Dyke) back in house, which presented an ever-expanding range of issues to address. However, I am pleased to report that considerable improvements have been made, new tenants are moving in, and further community projects are either underway or being planned. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our staff for their endurance during the reorganisation of the allotments. I believe we have all learnt valuable lessons from this process.

The ongoing development of the allotments saw the potential for a Community Woodland and the possibility of introducing an accessible plot.

The Energy Surveyor was contacted to acquire a detailed energy audit report to focus on reducing energy consumption and the feasibility of installing solar panels with the hopes of creating a "community Network"

Looking ahead, the committee continues to adapt its working methods to meet expanding responsibilities whilst maintaining effective oversight of our environmental priorities for the town.

Finance & General Purposes Committee Report:

This is my fourth report as Chair of the Finance and General Purposes Committee. I wish to express my gratitude to the team of staff especially the Council's Responsible Financial Officer, Victoria Exon, for their dedication to the job and expertise in the role.

As the Council staff and commitments continue to grow there continue to be complex issues requiring much teamwork within the Council and from external advisors. These take up more than their fair share of time but have in the past year been resolved well and managed efficiently and professionally by Victoria for the best benefit of the residents.

The staff and Councillors are now using the facilities offered by the home on Marshall Avenue and we are finding that residents are becoming more familiar with the location and are popping in regularly with issues for the Council and Councillors to deal with. The monthly Councillor surgery continues to grow and offer the opportunity for issues to be raised face to face.

We have managed to maintain a very modest increase in the precept for 2025/26 despite the growing size of the team and commitments to the town.

We continue to monitor the budget very closely on a monthly basis and, of course, as a small team work very closely together to manage any negative variances when they arise and look for reasons of positive variances so that the budgetary process can be managed better in the future.

The cost-of-living crisis continues to strike our town and many areas of it are still within a state of poor deprivation so we continue to be committed to offering the residents of the town a value for money representation and of course we remain open to any suggestions which can be heard at any open Committee meeting.

The Committee was pleased to be able to award small grants totalling £8297.75 during the year. Grants were awarded, once again, to a wide range of local organisations to enable them to grow and work further with the people of the town. We continue to promote this opportunity for groups within the town and should you feel that you would wish to apply for a small grant of up to £500, then please contact the Council Officers who would be only too happy to help.

2. To support the involvement of non-profit making organisations in the development of the town by providing grants and practical support. (This objective will include working and acting together to honour the Armed Forces Covenant Scheme that has been adopted by the ERYC).
3. To work with the appropriate agencies to protect and enhance the natural and built environment of Bridlington to provide the residents and tourist/visitors with a safe, healthy and enjoyable town in which to live, work and holiday.
4. To request from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council a breakdown of income generated, and expenditure related, to the delivery of Special Expenses council services within Bridlington and to monitor this activity.
5. To work towards Bridlington becoming a benchmark regarding the actions taken by the whole community to reduce the impact of the climate emergency.
